President's Message

DDCF distributed \$179,246 in community grants, managed funds, designated grants, and scholarships in 2021.

All donations to the DDCF are income tax deductible.

Over \$2 million in grants have been distributed by DDCF since 1996.

All donations count, large and small.

Donations are invested with the generated interest income given back to local community organizations through the DDCF grants program.

Every penny donated has been invested and will generate money for generations to come.

2021 was an amazing year for the Dauphin and District Community Foundation. Our Spring and Fall grant total to local community groups was \$115,313 with total scholarships available of \$24,211. I want to thank this wonderful community and the foresight of the donors. Your contributions have kept our Foundation in the top 3 of the Endow Manitoba Giving Challenge for the last 3 years running. This matching program adds funds to our local foundation with Endow Manitoba and the Government of Manitoba stretching donations even further.

In person meetings were still not possible when we started the year and Zoom/Team meetings were the norm. Board members were getting used to these types of meetings and adapting to be able to share thoughts and ideas. New board members have been a positive with new ideas and new energy coming into the foundation. As the restrictions are removed and more options for events and activities are possible, our foundation will be trying some new things to get more visibility in the community. Our foray into online promotion through Facebook, Instagram and Twitter has allowed us to reach our donors more often to show off what the Foundation is supporting and who the board members are. If you are seeing these posts, please make sure to like and share each time. This will help spread the word about DDCF as it is still amazing that after more than 25 years, some community members are unaware of the projects that the Foundation supports.

One of our newest programs for donors is the "2% Club" in which we are encouraging community members to consider donating a percentage of their estate to the foundation. 2% is a starting point for anyone to include in their wills to support a community you appreciate in perpetuity. Last year, we received our largest estate bequest to date by one of our long-time supporters and fundholders, Anne Stewart, who believed wholeheartedly in the foundation and this community. Her generous bequest has bolstered the DDCF's holdings and increased our available grants. Please consider talking to your lawyer and ask to add in a clause for donation to the foundation.

I wish to thank the past board members I have worked with, Clifton Flett, Desiree Dorion, and Daniel McKay, the board members I continue to work with and those new to the board, Justin Tokarchuk, Sherrie Volk, Kristen Haverluck and Dan Ward. Your support and continued dedication to improving the Foundation and community is much appreciated and make being the Chair a privilege. A special thanks goes out to Kit Daley, Executive Director, who keeps us all in line and the foundation running seamlessly.

DID YOU KNOW:

- In 2021 we had \$93,451 available for granting from our Undesignated pool which includes Named funds, Field of Interest funds, and Donor Advised funds and the Shane Allard Memorial fund plus we gave out \$14,276 to designated funds, \$47,308 to managed funds and \$24,211 in scholarships, for a total of \$179,246!
- In 26 years DDCF has awarded over \$2 million in grants and scholarships
- Endowments exceeded **\$3.75 Million** at the end of 2021.
- DDCF administers over 80 separate funds including 21 Scholarship funds and 26 Undesignated funds
- DDCF assists other local area community organizations by managing their local community funds

FREIHEIT FAMILY FUND—The Freiheit Family Fund has been set up as a Named Fund (Unrestricted Community Fund). This means that DDCF can provide grants based on the most pressing needs of Dauphin and the surrounding area, now and into the future. The fund was initiated by Kathy Freiheit, who had a long association with the Foundation. Kathy worked tirelessly to help achieve the goals of the community foundation and she served as president for two years. It was an honour for Kathy to receive the 2018 Philanthropist of the Year award given by the foundation.

Kathy was a person of integrity and compassion and she worked to enhance the lives of others in her vocation in mental health and her volunteer activities, even in the time of her illness to her passing in March of 2022. The family is proud to honour Kathy with this fund and her legacy will live on, so in her case it is true that she left the world a better place for being in it.

DAUPHIN OCHRE BAND PARENTS ORGANIZATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND—Dauphin Ochre Band Parents Organization started this scholarship fund to benefit students who had demonstrated their commitment to music. COVID-19 cancelled all of the trips they would normally have taken and these funds were used to ensure an annual scholarship would be available recognizing their hard work.

CLASS OF 2020 SCHOLARSHIP FUND—The Class of 2020 was unable to hold a celebration due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Safe Grad committee recognized the many disappointments these students faced, but also how strong and resilient they were. The Safe Grad committee wanted to use their fundraising efforts to benefit future hard working graduates reach their goals, while recognizing the Class of 2020.

BELLEMARE FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FUND—”Regent and I were educators in Kelsey and Mountain View school divisions for many years. Getting the best education possible has always been very important our family, so setting up a family scholarship seemed like a natural extension of our beliefs. We assisted Syrian refugee families settle into life in Dauphin and were their Canadian friends in many ways. We feel it is really important that new Canadians follow their dreams and have the opportunity to pursue post secondary education. They have much to contribute to Canada and we want to support that. Our family scholarship is one step along their journey to make that happen. This scholarship also provides a great gift idea.
